DEAR TJC,

As I look back over the last 16+ years of our church's history, I stand in awe. God has created an incredible movement within TJC. Defining moments fill these years in marking significant events that shape who and what people and churches become.

In 2006, we decided to publicly launch TJC from a small group meeting in my living room. The core group consisted of less than 50 people, but we were committed to biblical community, worship, and understanding a real relationship with Christ. The Lord blessed this boldness. We knew He had already planned our path and would chart our future if we stepped out in faith.

Within 18 months, the church grew to 100 people in a rented storefront that held less than 60. But then another big question emerged: could we keep reaching people in this little building? God then provided a school where we set up and tore down our worship and kids ministry every Sunday. Again, God blessed our faithfulness as we reached more and more people.

The growth continued when we learned of an available building in Lebanon near Cumberland University. It was way bigger than we thought we needed or could afford. Little did we know that it would be in that building, over a decade, that we would be shaped and formed into a church of 800 people. Well, we outgrew it too, and ultimately needed to have five services on the weekends just to make it work.

In 2018, discussion amongst elders and staff shifted to the long-term. We knew our space wasn't sustainable for our expectation of long-term growth and ministry. We embarked on a journey of looking and praying for God to open a door, and He did. The current TJC space, coupled with new ministries and a new vision, was launched with the Hope Multiplied initiative. In June 2020, TJC held its first gathering at our current location.

Since moving to our current building, TJC has witnessed unprecedented growth, not just numerically, but spiritually. The health of our church has never been greater. The future has never looked brighter. It is not about numbers but rather our purpose. We have always been true to God's Word and ardently believed that God's people will find a home where His truth is boldly professed.

When I look back at our history, I smile thinking of the big steps of faith the people of TJC have taken when we believed God was showing us the next hill to climb and the direction to take. We are at such a junction again. We believe God is calling us to scale new heights and tackle new challenges. It is time for us to "Build Up and Send Out." It is time for us to Arise and step into the future God has planned for us. It will take faith, sacrifice, and unity. We believe we are at a critical juncture in history and in our culture, which is exactly why TJC is here at this time and in this place.

I can't wait to someday look back again and tell the story about how this season we are entering became another defining moment in the life of this church.



HOW WE GOT HERE

From its beginnings, TJC has been committed to SHOWING JESUS AS INCOMPARABLY GLORIOUS. God has revealed His plan for our church as we strive in obedience to His call.

2005

TJC launches with a core group of 40 people, mostly young adults, led by Pastor Erik Reed. The core group is committed to biblical community and worship to connect others to the local church.

2007

As TJC continues to grow, the church relocates to West Elementary school where the congregation exceeds 100 people for the first time.

2011

Satellite campuses start in Hartsville and Mt. Juliet. Both became autonomous churches in 2013.

TJC's first "multi-site" location launches in Mt. Juliet.

2009 -

TJC relocates to a downtown Lebanon building (212 Leeville Pike) which becomes its home for over a decade. In it, TJC shapes and forms its vision and values.

2016 -

Launched 2 Saturday Services and 3 Sunday Services at 212 Leeville Pike to accommodate growth

2019

SEPTEMBER

The "Hope Multiplied" initiative begins. Over the next two years, the initiative gives birth to TJC's For the City (jail, foster, adoption, counseling, deacon care, and recovery ministries), For the Nations (partnerships with the International Mission Board and Frontiers sending partners), and greater discipleship opportunities (MDWK, TJC Institute).

2021

TJC helps launch Knowing Jesus Ministries and Journey Worship Co. as platforms to multiply scope and reach outside our walls.



WHERE WE ARE GOING

ARISE is a two-year execution strategy of our vision to "BUILD UP & SEND OUT." This vision will effectively build mature disciples and send them into a world where desperate people face a Christless eternity.

We believe that to whom much is given much is required (Luke 12:48). God has blessed TJC with incredible people, opportunities, influence, and resources. We have a responsibility to be a bold Great Commission church.

HOW WE LIVE THIS VISION

BUILD UP....

- ▶ CAPACITY: This is an exciting time as TJC continues to grow exponentially. We want to be a launching pad to serve our community, our nation, and our world. Building our physical capacity to train and equip disciples is critical to this mission.
 - We will increase worship and classroom space for kids, students, and young adults.
 TJC has an intentional master plan, to be executed in multiple phases as God

- continues to grow our congregation. The plan prioritizes TJC's greatest needs first while practicing good stewardship of financial resources.
- We will create an inviting environment with enhanced community areas, entries, walkways, exterior beautification, and increased parking. We envision our building being an everyday ministry hub where discipleship and service to our community happen constantly.
- ▶ PEOPLE: TJC is filled with courageous people who are humble yet hungry to use their diverse gifts to serve His Kingdom. It will take all of us to accomplish what God has set before us.
 - We will equip kids, students, and adults with Gospel-rich theology, a thirst for God's Word, and provide pathways for spiritual growth.
 - We will continue producing enriching content, curriculum, and teaching for our body and other churches.
 - We will explore opportunities to provide families with a robust and affordable Christian education.

- ▶ LEADERS: TJC endeavors to empower individuals to take ownership of impactful ministry opportunities. TJC leaders will be equipped for the challenges of today and tomorrow while inspiring others to join in accomplishing the vision.
 - We will raise up more leaders by identifying, equipping, and mobilizing disciples from within our body to fulfill God's calling.
 - We will continue to refine our intern and residency programs while investing in future leaders to be sent out in vocational ministry, church planting, and the mission field.
 - TJC will lead in sharing our organizational leadership system with the local church to improve efficiencies and encourage a Great Commission focus, vision alignment, and healthy evaluation standards to promote constant improvement.

SEND OUT.....

At TJC we strive to practice a Christ-reflecting joy in serving others inside and outside our walls. Service starts at home through the catalyst of the local church where a genuine Christ-exalting, self-minimizing humility is cultivated.

LOCAL

We will mobilize people and resources to expand our For the City ministries (Foster, Adoption, Jail, Re: Generation, Deacons, and Local Internationals).

- We will maximize opportunities to share the Gospel locally through relentless devotion from within our ministries and biblical community.
- We will multiply our relational reach through a contagious passion for people.

REGIONAL

- ▶ We will work with partner associations to plant churches in unevangelized communities throughout the nation.
- We will prepare pastors and leadership teams to accomplish our planting strategy.
- We will prioritize the planting, re-planting, and revitalization of churches nationally.

INTERNATIONAL

- We will send out our own to share the hope of Christ and plant churches among those unreached and without access to the Gospel.

- PRAY: We ask you to pray for the task ahead. In the book of Nehemiah, we see a determined disciple who was given a vision by God to accomplish what was believed to be an impossible task. When people tried to discourage Nehemiah he told other believers to "arise and build (Neh 2:20)." Nehemiah knows he cannot succeed without mobilizing everyone to restore Jerusalem. The same is true now at TJC.
- ▶ GIVE: Commit to sacrificial giving. In Luke 12:48 Jesus tells us "Everyone to whom much was given, of him, much will be required, and from him to whom they entrusted much, they will demand the more."
- ▶ GO: Participate in BUILD UP and SEND OUT opportunities. TJC is committed to being a Great Commission church (Matthew 28:18-20). In Mark 16:15 Jesus says "Go into all the world and preach the Good News to everyone, everywhere." We ask you to be obedient in living "sent."

MAXIMIZING OUR CAMPUS' POTENTIAL

In 2020, TJC acquired and renovated our current campus. We are so incredibly grateful that God provided us with this building. We are also overwhelmingly thankful for the hundreds of hours our people worked to renovate the space. The building more than doubled our worship space and tripled our education capacity.

By God's grace, TJC continues to grow at an exponential pace. Nearly one-third of our attendance on a Sunday is under the age of 12! Our Kids Ministry classrooms are averaging 85% capacity on Sundays. In addition, our Midweek activities have had to limit enrollment due to the lack of classroom capacity.

To keep up with the current and anticipated growth, and effectively BUILD UP and SEND OUT, TJC's physical space needs to expand.

Expansion requires a great deal of financial commitment. Therefore, responsible growth is critical to congregational health. To ensure good stewardship, TJC has developed an architectural master plan to be achieved in phases as actual and projected growth occurs. The master plan also ensures that TJC's most relevant needs are addressed first.

THE PRIORITIES ADDRESSED IN THE FIRST PHASE OF EXPANSION ARE:

- Increased education capacity
- More secure kids ministry and efficient transit of the interior of our building
- Expanded parking and improved parking lot flow
- Inviting community spaces
- Increased auditorium capacity





THE PROPOSED MASTER PLAN

A master plan provides a roadmap to determine what TJC's capacity can be at our current campus. The plan below will be accomplished in stages as growth demands.

OUR VISION OF PLANTING, SENDING, AND MULTIPLICATION HAS SHAPED THIS PLAN.





PHASE ONE IMPROVEMENTS

The initial phase addresses our most immediate needs. The architectural design is complete. The timing of these improvements is dependent on our cooperative giving.

PHASE ONE WILL PROVIDE:

- Over 8,000 square feet of new classroom space
- An expanded lobby
- Covered pathways that allow for more efficient transit throughout the building and more secure kids ministry
- Expanded parking and better traffic flow

- ▶ Inviting upgrades to the exterior of the building
- Areas for community-building, small groups, and conferences
- ▶ A ministry hub, anchored by a coffee shop, providing daily opportunities to reach our community




EDUCATION SPACE

Approximately 8,000 new square feet of classroom space will house students, young adults, and alleviate classroom limitations of Midweek and other discipleship activity. This allows for the Kids Ministry to take over and renovate the gym, effectively doubling its usable space.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC FLOW

We will add over 100 new parking spaces and connect the east and west parking lots with a new road. This will aid in traffic flow, congestion, and better egress throughout the facility.



NEW PATHWAYS

New exterior covered walkways will connect our building from north to south and east to west. The walkways will provide a more intuitive front door, thus making our campus easier to navigate. Most importantly, the walkways will alleviate transit through the Kid's Ministry hallways, which will allow for better security.

COMMUNITY SPACES

TJC values relationships. There is no better place to build community than at your place of worship. We want people to feel welcomed, valued, and appreciated. This requires a building that is inviting from the outside as well as the inside. To accomplish this we will change the aesthetic of our exterior, create community spaces, and welcome the facility as a daily ministry hub.

FLEXIBLE WORSHIP SPACE

We are beginning to see the need for overflow capacity in the auditorium. As a stretch goal, a community room will add a connected space of up to 200 seats to the auditorium. It will also serve as a multi-use facility for smaller gatherings, conferences, and discipleship.



GROWING IN GENEROSITY

In Matthew 6, Jesus says, where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. We want to see everyone who calls this church home growing in generosity. We believe Christian generosity begins with giving to the local church and that every Christian should have a plan to support their local church. Whether you are considering giving for the first time, or you have faithfully given for years, we believe you will play an important role in ARISE.

As we grow in generosity, we not only increase our giving but also our Kingdom impact. Here is a guide to help you along the way.

"I AM GIVING FOR THE FIRST TIME."

Generosity always begins with a first step. Taking that first step is never easy, but required if you are going to grow. If you have never given before, take your first step by giving today.

2 "I HAVE GIVEN BEFORE, BUT NOT CONSISTENTLY."

If you have given something in the past, but do so inconsistently, oftentimes your next step is to begin giving regularly. A great way to move from giving occasionally to giving consistently is to set up a recurring gift.

3 "I GIVE CONSISTENTLY, BUT NOT AS MUCH AS I COULD."

The consistent giver has taken steps to give regularly. They are committed to the act of giving. At this stage, our next step in growing in generosity is to give in a way that reflects the generosity we have been shown through Christ. The next step to growing in generosity is to evaluate the level at which you are giving.

"I FAITHFULLY GIVE 10% OF MY INCOME."

Tithing simply is giving back the first 10% of what God has given us. The tithing giver has gone from giving consistently to giving intentionally in a way that models a heart of generosity. Growing in generosity means looking for additional ways to further God's Kingdom with your resources.

"I GIVE MORE THAN 10%, PRIORITIZING GOD'S KINGDOM OVER MINE."

The sacrificial giver is someone who gives beyond what is normal or accepted. When we grow into sacrificial giving, we begin to choose God's Kingdom over our comforts. The sacrificial giver shows the transforming work Jesus has done in our lives by giving in a way that impacts their lifestyle.

6 "I GIVE TO MAKE A KINGDOM IMPACT THAT OUTLASTS ME."

The legacy builder believes that every resource, whether financial or otherwise, is a gift from God to be used for His Kingdom purposes. The legacy builder intentionally gives by acknowledging that their generosity will outlast them and that everything in their life is to be freely and generously given for God's work. Legacy building leaves an impact that outlasts the giver and serves the Kingdom beyond their lives.

TESTIMONAL

FAQS

HOW ARE WE SEEKING THE LORD'S GUIDANCE IN THESE EFFORTS?

► TJC leadership began the process of constructing ARISE with prayer and reflection. Over several months, certain convictions on where God was leading became clear. The process continued with those convictions as the foundational elements of ARISE. The process was prayerful and collaborative, ultimately leading to BUILD UP and SEND OUT. Over the coming years, we as a congregation must continue to seek the Lord's guidance in how to most effectively execute this strategy.

HOW BIG DOES TJC WANT TO BE?

▶ Our conviction is not to be concerned with the size of TJC but rather our effectiveness. We believe we live in a world that desperately needs to know Jesus. We want to build up and send out leaders to reach others. Practically speaking, there is a limit to our capacity at our current campus, however, our sending strategy includes planting churches with those who are called and prepared to take the Gospel to other locations.

WHY IS THERE SO MUCH EMPHASIS ON SENDING?

▶ TJC is a Great Commission church living faithfully to what Jesus commands in Matthew 28:16-20. Sending is not just something we do but it is who we are, because Jesus commands us to be. TJC is devoted to doing our part in fulfilling this command by telling others the Good News everywhere - near and far.

WHY IS OUR VISION CHANGING?

Our vision statement describes TJC's purpose, defines achievement, and aligns our efforts to ensure responsible use of resources. While our mission statement, Showing Jesus as Incomparably Glorious, doesn't change, the vision statement will as we develop as a body. When executed properly, a vision statement ensures we fix our eyes outward and not stagnate internally.

HOW IS THIS VISION DIFFERENT FROM THE PREVIOUS VISION?

▶ TJC's last vision established a great deal of discipleship opportunities and ministries that help define our church today. TJC has developed robust resources and relationships in this process. This vision will focus on how to send our resources and people to carry the Gospel to others near and far. We do not expect to add numbers of new ministries, but rather strengthen and deepen current ones.

WHY IS THIS CALLED ARISE!?

▶ In the book of Nehemiah, we see a determined disciple who was given a vision by God to accomplish what was believed to be an impossible task. When people tried to discourage Nehemiah he told other believers to "arise and build (Neh 2:20)." Nehemiah knows he cannot succeed without mobilizing everyone to restore Jerusalem. The same is true now at TJC.

ARE THERE PHASES TO THIS EXPANSION?

Yes, TJC has partnered with Visioneering Studios to provide a comprehensive master plan design for what can be accomplished at our current location. The plan took into consideration priorities and information provided by a team of TJC congregants, leadership, and staff. The plan builds on itself and can be added in phases as needs develop and resources are available.

WHY ARE WE NOT BUILDING A WHOLE NEW FACILITY?

A new facility was determined to be costprohibitive. In addition, TJC is intent on maximizing the potential of the gift God has blessed us with at our current location.

HOW MUCH WILL THE FACILITY EXPANSION AND RENOVATION COST?

▶ The cost of the entire building and renovation project will be approximately \$8 million. We have received good-faith estimates based on current construction pricing from our architect for the scope of work to be done based on national estimates and pricing from current projects. As we continue to move the construction project forward, the numbers may change, but we have confidence that the current estimate is realistic given what is happening on similar projects around the country.

WHY SHOULD I CONSIDER GIVING TO ARISE!?

As Christians, we want to obey the Scriptures and obey the call to give to the local church. In giving to ARISE, you are financially supporting the expansion of God's kingdom here, near, and far. Giving to this initiative allows TJC to continue building up and sending out those who will proclaim the Gospel. ARISE also allows us to expand our capacity to train and equip the disciples.

ARE WE FINANCIALLY HEALTHY AS A CHURCH?


▶ Yes. We are, by God's grace and the generosity of many of you, in a very financially healthy position. We currently have more than 3 months of operating reserves, and 6 months of debt service reserves. Even in taking on new debt for this project, our debt service will not exceed 20% of our budget. As we move into this project we are committed to retaining those reserves and holding a sound financial position into the future.

HOW CAN FAMILIES PARTICIPATE?

▶ We encourage you to discuss the vision with your children. Ask them about what they are learning about building up their knowledge and love for Christ. And, ask them what it means to share Christ with others. We want everyone to be inspired by the vision and aspire to play their part in God's plan for their life. This is also a great opportunity to teach your children about generosity. Think about filling out a commitment card as a family.

WHAT IS A COMMITMENT CARD?

A commitment card is a tool to pledge an amount of giving to this initiative. We have a goal to see 100% participation. The commitment card allows tracking that goal. Examples of the Commitment Card we will all fill out can be found in this guidebook.
